
Anarchism (Briefly)

Anarchism is revolutionary anti-state socialism. In practical terms, anarchists aim for the destruction of the power of the ruling elite, and of all relationships based on domination and submission. This means taking over our industries and communities and changing them to meet the needs of all, as well as the ecological needs of the environment. Without this takeover, we can struggle within capitalism, but never replace it. Anarchism will be created by millions of people not a dictatorial elite (we are not Marxist-Leninists), and all will have their part to play in shaping it. Power will lie within the councils, federations and organisations created by and for the revolution, not with political parties who will try to dominate and destroy them. The new society will not be born through abstract ideas, but will come out of the realities of struggle and the need for working class people to unite. Such struggle doesn't just involve resistance to ruling class power (strikes, occupations and other forms of direct action), but also construction - the building of new, locally based federal organisations, plus the forging of solidarity and the willingness to go all the way. There is no truce in a class war. The answer to ruling class power is continual widening struggle for social revolution and anarchism.

The Class System

We live in a bitterly divided class society. It consists of the working class, the middle class and the ruling class. We, the working class, who comprise the vast majority of the population, are forced to sell our labour and brains to meet our basic needs: food, housing, clothing, etc. The Salaries we earn are but a mere fraction of what we produce for the bosses and the ruling class. Workers may each be able to make 20 or 30 video machines a week, but our salaries will only allow us to buy one, if even that! This is one example of capitalism. We produce the wealth, not for ourselves, but for the ruling class who “reinvest” thus wealth back into the banks, machinery, raw materials, etc - and ultimately into the luxurious lifestyles they are able to lead. This keeps the cycle of capitalism rolling - always to the benefit of the rich. This tiny elite, the ruling class, made up of the most greedy parasites such as politicians, church leaders, managing directors, top cops, generals, etc., own and control everything. They have the money, the land and the power. 5% OF THE POPULATION OWN

80% OF ALL WEALTH (*Workers Solidarity* - May/June '95 edition). The state - government, ministries, police, army, schools, prisons, media, mental homes, etc. - though it may occasionally work against capitalism, keeps this process in order, and crushes those who dare to resist. We cannot expect real change to come through parliament, just as we cant expect real justice through the courts. These institutions were set up and the rules made by the ruling class, to protect their own interests and control working class anger.

Divide and Rule

What the capitalists fear most is the working class uniting against them. To prevent this they erect artificial barriers, and deliberately foster ideas based on ignorance (such as racism and sexism). When it comes to lack of housing we are told to blame the “Nigerian” family on the corner, not the capitalist who owns 3 or 4 houses each costing thousands of Rands. When companies lay off workers, and unemployment rises, we’re told to blame whites/blacks, women workers, immigrants or the unions - not the bosses, who can overnight fire thousands of people. White against black, Men against Women, Heterosexuals against Gays, Jewish against Christian, Pirates fans against Swallows fans... all barriers created to divide us, and maintain their profits

Nothing to Lose!

One of our first tasks as class struggle anarchists is to expose these false divisions, mystifications, and lies that prevent the workers and poor from uniting and struggling together. We encourage and participate in working class struggles and strive to see anarchist ideas and tactics accepted and used by those involved and argue for solidarity within the working class. We urge those involved in struggle to take control of their own fight

directly, and, as such, are strongly opposed to all those groups, parties and organisations that dare to think they can lead the working class. History has proven, time and time again, that the most successful actions the working class have done are when we have worked by ourselves, without the “help” of trade union bureaucrats, the vanguards, the parties, etc. As a class, we must see through and smash all obstacles strewn in our path to revolution by the trade union bosses, politicians and the leftist reformists. We can only do this by constant day-to-day class struggle.

Got No Class?

Attempts have been made to say that class is a thing of the past, apparently because we might own a TV set and might be able to afford a video recorder after slaving away in a crummy office or stinking factory for years, but the power, control and wealth stays firmly in the hands of the capitalists. The mystification and deliberate attempt at confusing class is vital to the rich elite.
